



CRISIS AND SECURITY MANAGEMENT



Dates of the course: 26.-30.05.2025

Place: Turība University, Riga, Latvia

About the course:

The world is coping with a wide range of challenges such as migration, cyber-attacks, organized crime and other new challenges, including virus-led crisis, war in Ukraine, hybrid attacks and similar. Security challenges are important for any organisation, company, institution, region or whole country, so experienced and well-trained security specialists who know how to deal with the crisis are vital for Europe. Students must be educated and trained about crises management, resilience, response management to difficult situations.

During the intensive blended programme students will have the opportunity to learn about security risk and crises management, develop skills and gain knowledge about planning and implementing security management in various organizations. They will also learn about crises management, how to react, respond and lead crisis management. Of course, security education also requires practical knowledge and cooperation, so the course will include practical activities such as team challenges and exercises, and other activities that can be crucial factors in real situations.

There will be **3 introduction on-line lectures** where students will get to know other participants and will participate in lectures about security basics, security risk management and crisis management. Dates: **08.05.**; **15.05.**; **22.05.2024**, afternoon from 16:00- 17:30, Eastern European Time (EET).

Students will receive **3 ECTS** for the course.

Participants – bachelor and master students of Security and Business field, any other students interested in security and crisis management topic. Only students from partner Universities (having ERAMUS+ cooperation agreement with Turība University) are accepted for the course.

Costs – Turība University will cover accommodation costs in Students' hostel, study programme, study visits, teaching materials and lecture costs.

Travel and stay costs must be financed from the partner University ERAMUS+ mobility grant.

Students must apply to the course through the National Coordinator at their home university.

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
